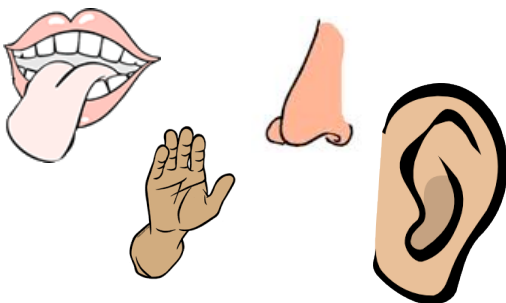
What do you notice about this book? How do you think it was made?

- "Hearing." (Emilie & Ester S.)



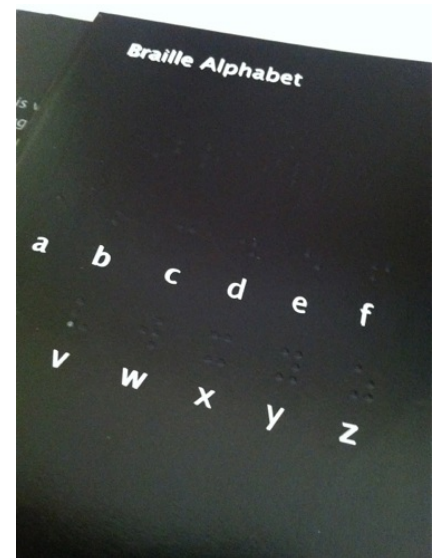
Which sense is missing? Why do you think the author hasn't included this sense?
